REMINDERS:

- a. Applicants are advised to take their meals prior to coming over for their medical examination since food is not allowed within the premises and all the initial blood and urine tests do not require a fasting state.
- b. Females within the reproductive age group are advised not to schedule their medical examination during their menstrual period. Otherwise, they will be required to come back one week after the last day of their menstruation.
- c. Applicants who have been scheduled for additional examinations must come on their designated examination date and time.

Required Documents

A. Health Examination List or the Examination Referral Letter which contains your **HAP ID/ TRN** number

B. Original passport (Primary and preferred form of identity documentation)

* If original passport is not available:

- a Health Examinations List (HAP letter) or equivalent documentation on the department's letterhead or an email which contains the applicants personal details and lists their required health examination **and** a photocopy of your passport photo page that has been certified by the department or a contracted Service Delivery Partner (SDP) of the department.
- a Health Examinations List (HAP letter) with a photograph of the applicant attached that has been officially stamped by local Australian overseas mission certifying the applicants identity.
- Non-migrating applicants who does not have a passport or already given to Embassy:
 - Government issued ID's
 - Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) ID (laminated version with photo)
 - Voter's ID (laminated version with photo)
 - Driver's license
 - Social Security System (SSS) ID
 - Postal ID
 - Professional Regulations Commission (PRC) ID
 - Unified Multi-Purpose ID

*For children

- NSO birth certificate and at least one form of identification with a photo (school ID)

C. Please bring black ballpen

D. Please bring the following if available/applicable:

- Old chest x-ray films not less than 3 months prior to the medical examination
- Detailed medical certificate regarding a previously-treated or currently managed clinically significant illness which should contain the following information:
 - duration and date of treatment
 - surgical procedure or medical intervention done
 - complete final diagnosis
 - outcome of treatment or treatment plans and prognosis, if available
- Your prescription spectacles/eyeglasses or contact lenses

(Medical Fees quoted are for the basic examinations plus any subsequent necessary investigations, IGRA test and treatment for tuberculosis (TB). Please note that applicants will still have to pay additional fees for any other additional tests/referrals needed for non-TB related issues)

Permanent visa applicants 2-10 years old are required to undertake either a Tuberculin Skin Test (TST) OR a TB Blood Test (Interferon Gamma Release Assay or IGRA)

- Tuberculin Skin Test (TST) requires 2 clinic visits. Second visit is between 48 and 72 hours from TST placement.
- The TB Blood Test (Interferon Gamma Release Assay or IGRA) will only require 1 clinic visit if results are negative. **(Please schedule medical examination on WEDNESDAYS if an IGRA test (Exam 719) is required, blood collection for IGRA test is done from 7:00 am to 8:00 am only)**

Chest X-ray will be required for children 10 years old and below if they have a positive TST/IGRA result or have exposure to TB Cases or a history of TB disease
